 - **Would you be willing to implement any or all the following procedures?**
 - only one customer at a time
 - specific times for children and seniors
 - remove or close off your waiting room area
 - designate areas on the floor where customers can stand and wait
 - time limits on services
 - age restriction on clients
 - clients must complete a survey as to whether a member of their family or someone that they have been in contact with has or had Covid-19 prior to coming into the salon.
 - take clients temperature before they can enter the salon
 - large salons would provide their employees with a rotating schedule
 - should the cosmetologist and the customer wear masks and gloves (when able)
 - for protection, use movable barriers such as plexiglass dividers
 - amp up the mandatory sanitation and disinfectant procedures that are already in place by the CANB, before and after each customer
 - customers must use the hand sanitizer before and after their service (salons will provide)
 - wear Protective Personal Equipment
